

# Legislation Report V.P.s....Elaine Freeman/Ann Duran

## Existing law requires that the sale or transfer of any firearm to be processed through a

SB 1159 Firearms: Annual Registration of Firearms

licensed firearms dealer. This bill would require: every firearm in the state (except law enforcement) to be annually registered with

the State; require the registrant to annually pay a fee to be deposited into a

special fund that is continuously appropriated to the department for the express purpose of carrying out the administration and enforcement of the firearm registry; require the department to establish registration information available to other law enforcement agencies; require the department to make reasonable efforts to notify firearms dealers, firearm owners, and the general public

regarding registration requirements. Registration shall not be deemed evidence that the registrant is lawfully permitted to own or possess the registered firearm nor that they are the lawful owner of the firearm.

Prohibits the use of certain federal records in establishing or enforcing the registry.

AB 1595 Elections: Eligibility to Vote This bill removes the prohibition of those serving or having served prison for a felony to be able to vote. Would require an elections office to provide the incarcerated elector with the voting materials required to be sent to a vote by mail voter in the locations


